## **Book Drive**

Each year, GGUW partners with Barnes & Noble to collect needed books to distribute throughout our community. These, along with other donated books are distributed by GGUW and partner organizations to ensure that all children have a book of their own to read at home. Book distribution highlights include:

- **Belgrade Fall Festival Parade** "*FALL*ing in love with books" GGUW distributes over 400 books to children ages 0-12 along the parade route. One excited child said, "*This is the best part of the parade!*"
- Gallatin Early Childhood Community Council ECCC distributes books at early childhood events, including

- Child Development Day, New Student and Kindergarten Registration Day, Preschool Fair and Parade of Preschools, and Family Forums held in Bozeman, Livingston, Belgrade, and Big Sky.
- Gallatin City-County Health Department Maternal Child Health Program "Thanks again for giving us books to distribute on our home visits for our Public Health Home Visiting Program. We y use the "Parents As Teachers" evidence-based home visiting model. This model encourages home visitors to give a children's book at every visit in an effort to support our parents reading with their children. The families that we serve typically are identified as "high risk" due to issues including domestic violence, age, mental health concerns, substance abuse, and socioeconomic status. We receive referrals from health care providers, WIC, the Department of Family Services, and Bozeman Deaconess Hospital. - **GGUW kidsLINK Afterschool Program** Books are added to the afterschool program libraries. Afterschool programs are located at 29 school-based/linked sites across 4 counties, serving over 1,500 children daily. "Giving and sharing the gift of reading is one of the best ways to achieve students' academic performance. It helps with fluency, comprehension, spelling, and overall language development. Reading is also a wonderful pastime." Megan Brenna, kidsLINK Program Director
- **Child Care Connections** Books are used in Child Care Connection's Child Care Provider Training and Education Programs. In addition, books are given to families in their Family Service Program.
- Community Health Partners Reach Out and Read Doctors and nurses distribute books to children 0 5 years old when they have a medical or dental visit. Approximately 150 books a month are distributed through their 6 clinics in West Yellowstone, Belgrade, Bozeman, Livingston and 2 dental clinics.
- **Belgrade Festival of Lights & Belgrade Community Library** Books are distributed to families participating in the festivities at the library.
- **GGUW & Big Brothers Big Sisters of Gallatin County** "Little's" receive a book during their holiday party in December.
- Thrive Partnership Project and Thriving Babies Program Thrive's home visiting program provides families
  with parent education, life skills, assistance accessing community resources and encouragement to
  grow. Books are used by providers and given to families.
- **Livingston Food Pantry Library** Families in need select books from the pantry library while acquiring healthful food.
- Bozeman & Belgrade Schools Kindergarten Registration Books are given to families at kindergarten registration.
- **Big Sky Youth Dynamics** Books and backpacks were given to teenagers staying in the Big Sky Youth Shelter.
- Week of the Young Child Conference Books are given to families who participate in activities during this week-long event.
- Bozeman Library Summer Learning Program
- Belgrade Community Library and GGUW kidsLINK Afterschool Family Nights
- Gallatin Mental Health Center Provide books to young patients utilizing their services.
- Gallatin YMCA Children's Summer Programs and Teen Parents Y Achievers is a 6-week summer reading program for 1st 3rd grade children geared toward addressing the Achievement Gap; disparity in academic performance of educational attainment. Summer learning loss prevention for children who are reading at or below grade level or most at risk for falling further behind.
- **Livingston Roundup Parade "It's Blooming Books"** Volunteers for GGUW helped distribute 300 books during the parade.
- Summer School Library Opening Emily Dickinson and Meadowlark received approximately 50 books for their summer reading pilot project. During the summer, students may checkout books from their school library and are also receive a book to keep. The goal is to provide easy access to books, encourage summer reading and decrease summer learning loss.
